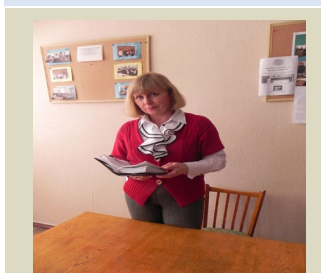

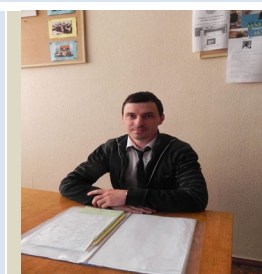
### LECTURES
