General information

Summary

This field of study encompasses the exploration of history and culture spanning from ancient eras to the contemporary period. Through the course of their studies, students will become familiar with significant historical and political figures, delving into their noteworthy achievements and evaluating their impact on the progression of Ukrainian and global history. To accomplish this, students will prepare an abstract report on a topic of their choice or one suggested by the course, enabling them to critically analyze and assess the contributions made by these influential figures.

Course objectives and goals

The purpose of the discipline "History and Culture of Ukraine" is to explore and delve into the rich historical and cultural heritage of Ukraine. Through this course, students are introduced to significant events, developments, and influential figures that have shaped the nation's history and cultural identity. By studying the history and culture of Ukraine, students gain a deeper understanding of the country's past, its traditions, customs, and artistic achievements. The discipline aims to foster a sense of pride, appreciation, and critical analysis of Ukrainian history and culture while promoting a broader perspective on the global historical and cultural landscape.

Format of classes

Lectures - 16 h., Workshops - 32 h., self-study - 72 h. Final control in the form of an exam.

Topic 4. Events of the XIX century - the beginning of XX in the History and Culture of Ukraine Topic 5. National-democratic revolution of 1917 – 1921 in Ukraine. Culture of Ukraine in 1920-1930s. Political situation. Famine in Ukraine

Topic 6. WW II and development of Ukraine in 1945-1985: main Tendencies and Contradictions Topic 7. Ukraine during the Period of "Perestroika", the Collapse of the USSR (1985-1991). Topic 8. Ukraine during the period of state independence. Contemporary Ukrainian culture

Topic 6. Ukrainian Question on the Eve and during the World War II. The period of M. Khrushchev

Topic 7. The Constitution of Ukraine, its place in the life of the society. Culture and civilization
