Summary

The course is focused on mastering the basic laws of the structure and principles of development of international economic integration and international organizations, their role in the system of international economic relations, the ability to analyze benefits and possible losses from the country's participation in certain organizations. .

Course objectives and goals

Acquisition of theoretical knowledge and practical skills and study of basic conditions, functions and principles of international economic integration and mechanisms of functioning of international organizations. Formation of students' skills and conscious involvement in deepening Ukraine's integration into the world community

Format of classes

Lectures, practices, consultation. Final control in the form of an exam

Globalization as a higher stage of internationalization of the world economy. Basic concepts and theoretical approaches to the analysis of globalization. Economic integration as a component of globalization processes.

The global economic space as an environment for the formation of international organizations. The main stages of formation and development of the system of international organizations.

Topic 3. Fundamentals of International Organizations Functioning

Legal regulation of activities of international organizations. Organizational and functional structure of international organizations

Topic 4. The United Nations and international economic cooperation

Goals and principles of the UN. Organizational and functional structure and social and economic bodies.

Topic 5. International monetary and credit organizations

Modern system of international monetary and credit organizations. International Monetary Fund - IMF. The World Bank Group. Regional development banks. Bank for International Settlements - BIS.

Topic 6. . International non-governmental economic organizations.

Features of the functioning of international non-governmental organizations. International associations of entrepreneurs. International trade and commerce and industry chambers.

Topic 7. . International organizations in the field of regulation of world trade

The World Trade Organization - WTO. United Nations Conference on Trade and Development - UNCTAD. United Nations Commission on International Trade Rights

Topic 8. Regional integration groups in the world

Peculiarities of regional integration groups in Europe, Asia, North and South America, Africa. Regional development banks.

Topics of the workshops

Topic 1. Globalization of the world economy

Prerequisites of globalization, evolution of directions and forms of manifestation of globalization. Determination of the main stages of modern integration.

Topic 2. . International organizations in the system of regulation of international economic relations

Typology of international organizations. The main preconceptions of the emergence.

Topic 3. Fundamentals of International Organizations Functioning

Construction of the organizational and functional structure of international organizations.

Topic 4. The United Nations and international economic cooperation

Analysis of specialized UN institutions and intergovernmental organizations related to the UN.

Topic 5. International monetary and credit organizations

Evaluation of the main aid and lending programs of Ukraine for 1992-2023. Analysis of credit lines from the IMF and World Bank, repayment schedule and trends.

Topic 6. . International non-governmental economic organizations.

The main areas of activity of UNCTAD/WTO and UNISTRAL in Ukraine.

Topic 7. . Regional integration groups in the world

Analysis and forecasting of development trends of integration processes in Europe

Topic 8. Activity of Ukraine in international organizations

Formulation of Ukraine's development directions in international integration processes. Development of proposals for strengthening cooperation with international organizations..
