## General information

### Summary

The discipline is aimed at the formation of students' scientific worldview, the formation of historical thinking, as well as the worldview of responsible citizens and patriots of their state. The course includes the study of socio-political, socio-economic and cultural processes that took place at various stages of the development of the Ukrainian people and Ukrainian statehood. The knowledge gained by students takes into account the current state and the most relevant achievements of historical science, and humanities in general, in the study of the past of Ukrainian society.

### Course objectives and goals

The acquisition by students of fundamental knowledge of the history and culture of Ukraine, as the basis for the formation of the worldview of a responsible citizen, the bearer of intellectual, moral and aesthetic qualities worthy of a highly educated specialist. The course is designed to provide students with the ability to independently analyze historical processes, causes and consequences of certain events, etc.

### Format of classes

Lectures, seminar classes, independent work (preparation of historical essays), consultations. The final control is a test.

## Features of the course, teaching and learning methods, and technologies

[The course is not a repetition of the History of Ukraine school course. The issues under consideration are presented according to the problem-chronological method. Based on previously acquired knowledge, students study cause-and-effect connections, modern relevant concepts of historical science and humanities in general, etc. Students have the opportunity to gain experience in public speaking, discussions, writing scientific papers, etc..]
